4 RACE BY-LAWS

The Registration	 Registration shall be on a first-come-first-get basis through the SportSG's online registration system: https://www.activesgcircle.gov.sg/getactive-singapore/pesta-sukan/sport/dragon-boat Each Team can register up to two (2) racing crews per respective category and racing division, however, priority will be given to the 1st registered crew. However, for teams who sign up for multiple categories, do note on risk of probable back-to-back races between categories.
Singapore PD2 Open (See Annex A)	 Each boat must comprise of minimum 4 to maximum 5 persons with a permanent disability. It is the responsibility of clubs to ensure that the total points for a crew do not exceed the maximum allowable under the rules. See Annex B Refer to for points system https://sdba.org.sg/wp-content/uploads/2020/11/Rules-for-Paradragon-Racing-Edn-1.0.pdf Temporary adaptations to race boats will be allowed provided they cause no damage to the boat; they are not considered by SDBA to offer an unfair advantage to the crew; the risk of their use is assessed by SDBA not to pose an unmanageable safety hazard

	 5) Steers and drummer in a crew need not be para-athletes themselves, but if they do, they do not contribute to the overall points calculated for impairments, age and gender. 6) Do ensure that you have your doctor's diagnosis form before crew list submission. This is to allow SDBA panellist to ensure your teams has sufficient point. See Annex B and Annex C
Singapore Para Open	 Minimum 10 racing crew permitted (8 paddlers + 1 drummer + 1 steer), must consist of 4 paddlers with permanent disability Maximum 12 racing crew permitted (10 paddlers + 1 drummer + 1 steer), must consist of 5 paddlers with permanent disability An able-bodied caregiver/supporter/volunteer may be permitted to accompany the person with disability inside the boat at the ratio of 1:1. Definition of disability shall be in accordance to Singapore's Enabling Master Plan SG Enable classification for physical, sensory, intellectual disabilities and autism. The Adaptive Team must be formed with a cause for a group of special needs society with a vision and plan for inclusivity. The Team needs to demonstrate that all participants would have trained together as a team for a period of at least 3 months in the spirit of social cohesion. There may be a request for doctor's diagnosis for persons with disabilities (to ensure level playing field).

5 RACE FORMAT

- 1. Each race shall be according to a max. 6 boat racing concept, per race, per category.
- 2. The racing lanes that shall be used in at the Water Sports Centre will be the physical Lanes 2 to 7
- 3. Race Format shall be: Heats -> Repechage -> Semi Final -> Final (whenever feasible) OR Direct Final race

6 COMPETITION REGULATIONS & RULES OF RACING

The races will be run in accordance with the IDBF Competition Regulations & Rules of Racing with specific SDBA Entry Rules.

7 ENTRY FEE

- 1. The Entry Fees are on a per boat per category/division basis

Annex A

- 1. The Partial Paradragon race category (abbreviated to PD2) broadens the scope for participation by Paradragons by allowing teams to comprise a mix of Paradragons and unimpaired paddlers.
 - a) The Paradragon paddlers in the crew need not have the same, or even similar, impairments but must, together, satisfy the 'scoring' requirement described in Annex B.
 - b) The steerer (or helm/sweep) and the drummer need not be Paradragons themselves but, if they are, do not form part of the overall score per Annex B (neither do the unimpaired paddlers).
 - c) The unimpaired paddlers can be of any age or gender and do not attract any points instead, the only consideration is how many are included. Annex B sets out how the numbers of unimpaired paddlers in the crew affect the overall maximum score permitted for the Paradragon paddlers.
- 2. In order to provide reasonably fair competition, each Paradragon paddler will be given points according to the paddler's:
 - a) impairment;
 - b) gender; and
 - c) age
- 3. The points for each Paradragon paddler in a crew will then be added together.
 - a) The resulting total score for the crew must not exceed those set out in Annex B.
 - b) Provided the total score does not exceed the maximum set out in these rules, the composition of the crew is entirely up to the crew's nation or club.
- 4. Procedure for the determination of points for impairments SDBA will use a combination of:
 - a) Diagnosis certificates (submitted before the competition); and
 - b) Sample assessments of selected athletes (at the competition)

to ensure, as far as is reasonably practicable, the points awarded to each athlete for that competition are fair and reflect the ethos of Paradragon competition.

- 5. Determination of provisional point 'scores'
 - a) The relevant race officials (appointed by IDBF-PAC) will then review each diagnosis certificate and allocate a provisional points 'score' for the individual.
 - b) These scores will be advised to the team so that it can make appropriate decisions on the composition of crews in order to conform to the requirements of the rules.
 - c) Where a Paradragon paddler has more than one impairment described on the diagnosis certificate, the impairment assessed to affect the paddler the most will be the one that is 'scored'. In other words, only one impairment will be 'scored' per paddler.
