4 RACE BY-LAWS

4.1	Eligibility	<p>a) This race is open to all SDBA's affiliates (Ordinary and Associate member) and non-affiliates</p> <p>b) b). Each crew must comprise of at least 70% Singapore citizens or permanent residents, (including drummer, steersperson and reserves), unless otherwise stated by the race organiser.</p> <p>c) A participant can only represent 1 team in each eligible category. If a participant is found to be registered with more than one team in the same category after the registration closing date, the participant will be disqualified from Pesta Sukan 2024. No substitution or replacement will be allowed. (<i>SportSG rules</i>)</p>
4.2	Registration	<p>a) Registration shall be on a first-to-register, first-to-get-slot principle through SportSG's on-line registration system. Registration shall be from 29th April 2025 (Tues) to 30th June 2025 (Mon).</p> <p>b) Each Team can register up to two (2) racing crew per respective category and racing division.</p> <p>c) Priority shall be given to the Team's 1st registered crew.</p> <p>d) The Team's 2nd crew will only be accepted subjected to the remaining availability of slots after the acceptance of all the other Teams' 1st crew registration.</p> <p>e) Exception is made for the Para Dragon category where each Team can submit more than two (2) racing crew.</p>
4.3	Minimum Age to Race	Minimum age to race is twelve (12) years old and must be accompanied, inside the dragon boat, by a parent or a responsible adult appointed by the parent.
4.4	Racing Crew configuration	<p>a) DB12 minimum configuration: 8 paddlers + 1 drummer + 1 steer + 0 reserves = 10 pax</p> <p>b) DB12 maximum configuration 10 paddlers + 1 drummer + 1 steer + 2 reserves = 14 pax</p> <p>c) DB22 minimum configuration 18 paddlers + 1 drummer + 1 steer + 0 reserves = 20 pax</p> <p>d) DB22 maximum configuration 20 paddlers + 1 drummer + 1 steer + 4 reserves = 26 pax</p>
4.5	Open Racing Class	No restriction on gender or crew composition for the racing crew (i.e. paddlers, drummer and steersperson).
4.6	Mixed Racing Class	a) DB12 crew - Paddlers composition on gender ratio:

5 ENTRY REQUIREMENT

5.1	DB12 Singapore U24 Youth Mixed	<p>a) Participants can come from Secondary Schools & Junior Colleges. They need <u>not</u> be in their respective A, B or C divisions.</p> <p>b) Participants can come from Tertiary Institutions & Club teams.</p> <p>c) The different divisions can be mixed in the boat.</p> <p>d) The maximum age for this category shall be 24 years old in the year of competition.</p> <p>e) Exception is made for the Steersperson.</p>

5.8	DB12/22 Pesta Sukan Open, Women and Mixed (2km - Ring Race)	<p>a) For all SDBA affiliate, associate member and non-affiliate</p> <p>b) For International Community Teams: (DB22) Minimum 6 Singapore citizens or PR in the Crew List, (DB12) Minimum 4 (including drummer, steersperson or reserves)</p>
5.9	DB12 Singapore PD2 Open (See Annex A)	<p>a) Each boat must comprise of minimum 4 to maximum 5 persons with a permanent disability.</p> <p>b) It is the responsibility of clubs to ensure that the total points for a crew do not exceed the maximum allowable under the rules. See Annex B</p> <p>c) Refer to for points system https://sdba.org.sg/wp-content/uploads/2020/11/Rules-for-Paradragon-Racing-Edn-1.0.pdf</p> <p>d) Temporary adaptations to race boats will be allowed provided (1) they cause no damage to the boat;</p>

5.10	DB12 Singapore Para Open	<p>a) Minimum 10 racing crew permitted (8 paddlers + 1 drummer + 1 steer), must consist of 4 paddlers with permanent disability</p> <p>b) Maximum 12 racing crew permitted (10 paddlers + 1 drummer + 1 steer), must consist of 5 paddlers with permanent disability</p> <p>c) An able-bodied caregiver/supporter/volunteer may be permitted to accompany the person with disability inside the boat at the ratio of 1:1.</p> <p>d) Definition of disability shall be in accordance to Singapore's Enabling Master Plan SG Enable classification for physical, sensory, intellectual disabilities and autism.</p> <p>e) The Adaptive Team must be formed with a cause for a group of special needs society with a vision and plan for inclusivity.</p> <p>f) The Team needs to demonstrate that all participants would have trained together as a team for a period of at least 3 months in the spirit of social cohesion.</p> <p>g) There may be a request for doctor's diagnosis for persons with disabilities (to ensure level playing field).</p>

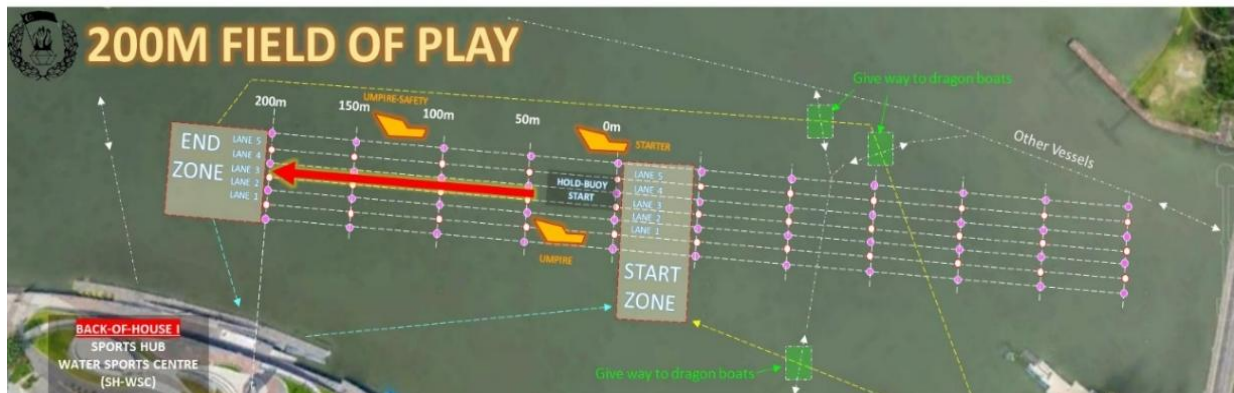

7.1 The Field-of-Play is the Kallang Basin Race Course ; Back-of-House is at Sports Hub Water Sports Centre

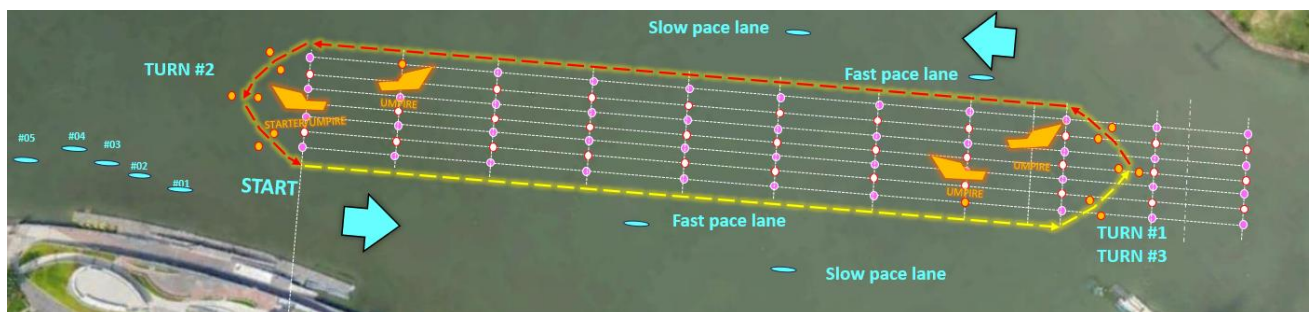
7.2 200m Race Course

- Racing lanes shall be Lane 2 to 7, with Boat #01 in Lane 2 and so on
- Start Procedure shall be the pontoon hold tail start.



7.3 2,000m Race Course

- 2½ rounds with 4 turns
- Each straight run = 350m
- Start Procedure: Floating chase start



8 ATTIRE / UNIFORM AND RACING EQUIPMENT

- 8.1 All teams are required to be in same jersey/uniform/attire (i.e. same colour, design, etc.). Rash guards, compression-wear and all types of bottoms (i.e. shorts, tights, etc.) are exempted.
- 8.2 Dragon Boat paddles must comply with IDBF standard Type 202a.
- 8.3 Personal Floatation Device (PFD) must be ISO 12402-5 standard or equivalent.
- 8.4 Teams that do not have own paddles and PFD are required to contact SDBA.

- 11.1 Teams shall be required to make payment after submission of Crew List.
- 11.2 The amount to be paid shall be based on the final CONFIRMED registration.
- 11.3 Payment for Registration Fees shall be made to SportSG's account.
- 11.4 Withdrawal of Team and/or racing crew after payment has been verified and confirmed:
 - a. No refund of the registration fee payment already made
 - b. Admin charge of \$108 for full Team withdrawal.
 - c. Admin charge of \$54 per racing crew per Team withdrawals.
- 11.5 Indemnity form to be submitted individually at <http://Go.gov.sg/pesta2025> before event day.
 - a. Individual to submit for every category they are taking part.

12 PROTESTS & APPEAL

- 12.1 Protests
A protest against a race result must be made within 10min after the result is officially announced.
- 12.2 Appeals
An appeal against a protest result must be made within 10min after the protest result is officially announced.
- 12.3 Protest / Appeal Fees
 - a. All protests / appeals shall be made in writing.
 - b. The protest / appeal form is available at respective pontoon area.
 - c. Fees Applicable:

- d. The protest / appeal fee may or may not be refunded if the protest/appeal is successful, SportSG will decide.

13 RESERVATIONS

- 13.1 SDBA reserves the rights to use any print or digital photos as well as videos of participants (as individuals or in a Team) taken by SDBA's officials and or appointed agents for educational, instructional, publicity and/or promotional purpose.
- 13.2 SDBA reserves the right to deny an individual and/or Team, participation in the event not due to infringement of Competition Regulations or Rules of Racing, if the individual and/or Team has any outstanding issues or matters with SDBA, i.e., outstanding disciplinary case, non-race related payments, etc.
- 13.3 SDBA reserves the rights to change, delete, remove, amend, change, or adjust in-full or in-part, the racing plan, format, schedule and program as SDBA sees fit, in the interest of maintaining a safe and feasible racing environment and condition, with or without informing the participants the reasons for the changes.

Annex A

1. The Partial Paradrageon race category (abbreviated to PD2) broadens the scope for participation by Paradrageons by allowing teams to comprise a mix of Paradrageons and unimpaired paddlers.

- a) The Paradrageon paddlers in the crew need not have the same, or even similar, impairments but must, together, satisfy the 'scoring' requirement described in Annex B.
- b) The steerer (or helm/sweep) and the drummer need not be Paradrageons themselves but, if they are, do not form part of the overall score per Annex B (neither do the unimpaired paddlers).
- c) The unimpaired paddlers can be of any age or gender and do not attract any points - instead, the only consideration is how many are included. Annex B sets out how the numbers of unimpaired paddlers in the crew affect the overall maximum score permitted for the Paradrageon paddlers.

2. In order to provide reasonably fair competition, each Paradrageon paddler will be given points according to the paddler's:

- a) impairment;
- b) gender; and
- c) age

3. The points for each Paradrageon paddler in a crew will then be added together.

- a) The resulting total score for the crew must not exceed those set out in Annex B.
- b) Provided the total score does not exceed the maximum set out in these rules, the composition of the crew is entirely up to the crew's nation or club.

4. Procedure for the determination of points for impairments

SDBA will use a combination of:

- a) Diagnosis certificates (submitted before the competition); and
- b) Sample assessments of selected athletes (at the competition)

to ensure, as far as is reasonably practicable, the points awarded to each athlete for that competition are fair and reflect the ethos of Paradrageon competition.

5. Determination of provisional point 'scores'

- a) The relevant race officials (appointed by IDBF-PAC) will then review each diagnosis certificate and allocate a provisional points 'score' for the individual.
- b) These scores will be advised to the team so that it can make appropriate decisions on the composition of crews in order to conform to the requirements of the rules.
- c) Where a Paradrageon paddler has more than one impairment described on the diagnosis certificate, the impairment assessed to affect the paddler the most will be the one that is 'scored'. In other words, only one impairment will be 'scored' per paddler.

1. A female Paradrakon with both **Ataxia and complete blindness** and **aged 45**:

Note: Ataxia is considered to impact paddling ability to a greater extent than blindness, so the 'score' for Ataxia is used.

2. A female Paradrakon, **visually impaired** (not fully blind) and **aged 19**:

3. A male Paradrakon with **PTSD and above elbow prostheses on both arms** and **aged 62**:
