**1. OFFICIAL TITLE OF CHAMPIONSHIP**

The official title of the competition is GetActive Singapore Pesta Sukan 2025: Beach Volleyball.

**2. ORGANISER**

The competition is jointly organised by Sport Singapore, and Volleyball Association of Singapore.

**3. EVENT REGULATIONS**

This competition is sanctioned by the Volleyball Association of Singapore.

All matches will be governed by the Volleyball Association of Singapore; and they must be played in accordance with the tournament regulations (see paragraph 10).

**4. DATE, TIME & VENUE**

4.2 The competition is held at Sports Hub beach volleyball courts, commencing at 9AM SHARP. Registration must be done 30 minutes prior to the start of your first match.

4.3 **The General Technical Meeting will be held at 7.00pm (all categories) on Wednesday, 9<sup>th</sup> July 2025 at Singapore Sports Museum (6 Stadium Walk Singapore 397698). Attendance is compulsory, should you not be able to make it please send a proxy in place for your team.**

## **6. RANKINGS AND AWARDS**

Prizes will be awarded to the top three (3) teams in each category.

**All players must be present at the closing ceremony to receive the awards. Absence will result in the immediate forfeit of prize and medals.**

## **8. REGISTRATION FORMS, FEES AND CLOSING DATE**

8.1 Entries are accepted on a first-come-first served basis.

8.2 Late entries will not be accepted.

## **9. PARTICIPATION & ELIGIBILITY OF PLAYERS & TEAMS**

9.1 2-on-2 Men's Open

- Each team may only register a maximum of 2 players
- Teams may register a maximum of one (1) foreigner (non-Singaporean and non-permanent resident) only.
- Minimum of 4 participating teams to commence with the competition.

9.2 2-on-2 Women's Open

- Each team may only register a maximum of 2 players
- Teams may register a maximum of one (1) foreigner (non-Singaporean and non-permanent resident) only.
- Minimum of 4 participating teams to commence with the competition.

### 9.3 2-on-2 Men's Masters

- Each team may only register a maximum of 2 players
- At least one (1) team player must be 35 years and above; i.e. born in/ before year 1990
- Teams may register a maximum of one (1) foreigner (non-Singaporean and non-permanent resident) only.
- Minimum of 4 participating teams to commence with the competition.

### 9.4 2-on-2 Women's Masters

- Each team may only register a maximum of 2 players
- At least one (1) team player must be 30 years and above; i.e. born in/before year 1995
- Teams may register a maximum of one (1) foreigner (non-Singaporean and non-permanent resident) only.
- Minimum of 4 participating teams to commence with the competition.

### 9.5 2-on-2 Mixed Open

- Each team may only register a maximum of 2 players
- Teams may register a maximum of one (1) foreigner (non-Singaporean and non-permanent resident) only.
- Minimum of 4 participating teams to commence with the competition.

### 9.6 4-on-4 Corporate Mixed Open

- Each team may only register a minimum of 4 and up to a maximum of 6 full time and/or contract staff of the same organisation (private, public and non-profit organisations).
- All team players must present their corporate staff ID for verification during registration.
- If a staff ID is not available, the respective company must submit a duly signed employment letter with the company stamp for each registered team player during registration, along with any other required endorsements (e.g., employment letter or pay slip) as specified by The Organiser.
- **One (1) female player must be in the match at all times.**
- Minimum of 4 participating teams from each category to commence with the competition.

## 10. COMPETITION REGULATIONS

### 10.1 2-on-2 Mixed Open, Gender Open and Gender Masters

#### 10.1.1 The championship will follow the FIVB Beach Volleyball Rules, Edition 2025-2028.

- For the new edition of 2025-2028 Beach Volleyball Rules, the main highlights are
  - Net Touch - is a fault when a player interferes with the opponent's play by:
    - touching the top band of the net or the top 80cm of the antenna during his/her action of playing the ball
    - taking support from the net simultaneously with playing the ball
    - creating an advantage over the opponent by touching the net

- making actions which hinder an opponent's legitimate attempt to play the ball
- Sanction Cards
  - Stage 1: No sanction - symbol verbal warning
  - Stage 2: No sanction - symbol Yellow Card
  - Penalty: Sanction - Symbol Red Card
  - Expulsion: Sanction - Symbol Red + Yellow Cards jointly
  - Disqualification: Sanction - Symbol Red + Yellow Cards separately

## 10.2 4-on-4 Corporate Mixed Open:

10.1.1 The championship will follow the FIVB OFFICIAL BEACH VOLLEYBALL RULES (VERSION 4 vs 4) 2023-2024

For the OFFICIAL BEACH VOLLEYBALL RULES (VERSION 4 vs 4) 2023-2024, the main highlights are

- Net Touch - is a fault when a player interferes with the opponent's play by:
  - touching the top band of the net or the top 80cm of the antenna during his/her action of playing the ball
  - taking support from the net simultaneously with playing the ball
  - creating an advantage over the opponent by touching the net
  - making actions which hinder an opponent's legitimate attempt to play the ball
- Disqualification Sanction Cards
  - Stage 1: No sanction - symbol verbal warning
  - Stage 2: No sanction - symbol Yellow Card
  - Penalty: Sanction - Symbol Red Card
  - Expulsion: Sanction - Symbol Red + Yellow Cards jointly
- Team Composite
  - For the match, a team may consist of up to 6 players, plus one Coach Throughout the match, the coach conducts the play of his/her team from outside the playing court. He /she selects the starting line-ups, the substitutes, and takes time-outs. In these functions his/her contacting official is the 2<sup>nd</sup> referee.
  - DURING THE MATCH, the coach sits on the team bench nearest to the scorer, except when switching courts, during set intervals and while instructing players during time outs.
  - requests time-outs and substitutions;
  - may give instructions to the players on the court only during the warm-up, change of set, between rallies, at switch of the court and during time-outs without disturbing or delaying the match.

10.3 Should any controversial incidents occur which are not stated in the regulations, the Organising Committee will be responsible for settling the dispute. **Any decision made by the Organising Committee is final.**

## **11 COMPETITION FORMAT & GAME PLAY**

11.1 Grouping followed by Knock-out Rounds.

11.2 Final Competition Format will be dependent upon the total number of participating Teams.

## **12 THE SYSTEM OF POINTS**

12.1 For 1 Set:

| i)  | Match won 1-0:   | 2 points for the winner, 1 point for the loser. |

12.2 For Best of 3 Sets:

| i)   | Match won 2-0:   | 3 points for the winner, 0 point for the loser. |
| ii)  | Match won 2-1:   | 2 points for the winner, 1 point for the loser. |
| iii) | Match forfeited: | 0 point   |

**NOTE:** *Team may still rank top of the group even if the number of winning match is lesser than another team.*

### **IN THE CASE OF A TIE**

- i) Points quotient = If the tie persists as per the set quotient (b) the teams will be classified in descending order by the quotient resulting from the division of all points scored by the total of points lost during all sets.
- ii) If the tie continues as per the point quotient (c) between two teams, the priority will be given to the team which won the last match between them. When the tie in point quotient is between three or more teams, a new classification of these teams in the terms of (a), (b) and (c) will be made taking into consideration only the matches in which they were opposed to each other.

## **13. SUBSTITUTION (FOR CORPORATE CATEGORY)**

13.1 A player of the starting line-up may leave the game, but only once in a set, and re-enter, but only once in a set, and only to his/her previous position in the line-up.

- A substitute player may enter the game in place of any player of the starting line-up, but only once per set, and he/she can only be substituted by the same starting player.
- **EXCEPTIONAL SUBSTITUTION**  
A player who cannot continue playing due to injury or illness, should be substituted legally. If this is not possible, the team is entitled to make an EXCEPTIONAL substitution.

## **14 UNIFORMS**

### **14.1 4-on-4 Corporate Mixed Open**

- Attire must be worn during the competition at all times.
- Male players are not allowed to play without shirts. All players have to be identically dressed for top.
- Female players must wear tops of the same colour and design.
- Jersey numbers and team names on jerseys are not compulsory.

#### 14.2 2-on-2 Mixed Open, Men's and Women's Open and Masters

- Numbered attire must be worn during the competition at all times.
- Male players are not allowed to play without shirts. Both players have to be similarly dressed (same jerseys that are numbered, and same coloured shorts with length not below the knee).
- The number must be placed on the chest area and the back of the jerseys.
- The numbers must be of a contrasting colour to the jerseys and a minimum of 10cm in height. The **stripe** forming the numbers shall be a minimum of 1.5cm wide.
- Female players must wear matching tops with numbers labelled clearly in the front on the chest (back not necessary). Bottoms/ briefs have to be of the same colour between partners.
- The numbers must be of a contrasting colour to the jerseys and a minimum of 10 cm in height. The **stripe** forming the numbers shall be a minimum of 1.5 cm wide.
- For Female players wearing Sports Bras, numbers need not be as above indicated sizes but HAVE to be clear and big enough for Referees' view.
- Team names on jerseys not compulsory.

14.3 Socks are permitted, should the sand be deemed too hot.

14.4 Footwear is not permitted.

### 16 CONTINGENCY

- 16.1 The Championship will stop in the event of lightning risk.
- 16.2 The Organising Committee holds the right to alter fixtures, tournament format and/or scoring system.
- 16.3 The Organising Committee will make announcements and/ or inform all team captains of any changes.
- 16.4 It is also the teams' responsibility to await further instructions from the Organising Committee on days of the tournament.
- 16.5 Inclement Weather Clause

The Organising Committee will suspend play when in their opinion, inclement weather warrants suspension. This decision is solely at the discretion of the Organising Committee who will determine if and when play is to continue. Should the Organising Committee need to announce that the tournament will not resume, the money will be dispersed accordingly.

- The Organising Committee holds the right to decide on any issues raised that are not stated in the General Regulations.
- The Association reserves the right to reject any registration that violates the rules and regulations.
- All decisions made by the Organising Committee are final.
