# INTEGRATED MOVEMENT APPROACH



This approach integrates movement with all aspects of a preschooler's life by incorporating strategies such as **Active Navigation Routes**, **Active Play Corners**, **Brain Breaks** and **Integrated Learning**.

## BRAIN BREAKS

Brain Breaks are short bursts of movement activities that EC educators can introduce in between lessons to help preschoolers refocus their attention. Below is an example of a brain break.



# GUESS THE ANIMAL (3-6 40)



#### OBJECTIVE:

To impart preschoolers with the following:

- Locomotor skills Jumping
- Object Control skills Underarm Throw, Catching
- Stability skills Balancing

# HOW TO

- 1. Toss the ball to the preschooler and get him/her to toss it back to the EC educator. The preschooler will have to act out his/her animal of choice.
- 2. The other preschoolers will have to mimic the movement and try to guess the animal.
- 3. The first preschooler to guess the correct animal will take over to do steps 1-3.

### MATERIALS NEEDED:

Ball

**NOTE:** EC educators can consider using other objects such as beanbags or crushed paper balls to toss/ catch.
